[ABDUA:14097](#)

Sandstone grave slab from the medieval period. It bears an incised ring-headed cross and the hilt and part of the blade of a single handed sword. Found at Nether Wardstone, St Cyrus, Kincardineshire.

[ABDUA: 50109](#)

Roman pan with handle, bronze, Stoneywood, Aberdeenshire.

[ABDUA:85147](#)

Medieval silver brooch, Cullen, Morayshire.

[ABDUA:64919](#)

Silver thimble c1700-1900, Rhynie, Aberdeenshire.

[ABDUA:17413](#)

Finely polished granite cup (600BC-1000). Found near, or within, one of the hut circles on Culbean Hill, Glengairn, Aberdeenshire.

[ABDUA:15644](#)

Part of a silver chain, double linked alternating with single links. Of a type usually referred to as 'Pictish'. Found at a depth of 18' on the North promontory of Nigg Bay, Kincardineshire, 1796.



7

[ABDUA:15505](#)

Glass ball, possibly a gaming piece or charm (production date 200-900). Ten coloured spirals. Surface find, Jericho Culsalmond, Aberdeenshire.

[ABDUA:14502](#)

Part of a hoard with sunflower-headed pin and two socketed axes (production date 1200 BC-600 BC). Similar to the neck-ring in the hoard found at Braes of Gight, near Haddo House in Aberdeenshire.

[ABDUA:64530](#)

Viking kidney-ringed metal pin found in Whitehills, Banffshire.

[ABDUA:39615](#)

Pictish stone. Red sandstone slab, St. Ringin's stone. Symbols: cross and boar (hindquarters) on the front, trisekele (triple spiral motif) on the back. Cairn o Mount, Aberdeenshire.

[ABDUA:19729](#)

Cordoned urn decorated with comb-impression cross-hatching. Found, protected by a small cist, at Seggiecrook, Kennethmont, Aberdeenshire, 1907. Contained cremated human bone, bead and clay pinheads.

[ABDUA:19690](#)

Gold ribbon torc, with bar terminals (knob ends), 1800 BC-600 BC. Ploughed up on the lands of Belhelvie Lodge on the afternoon of the 19th April 1852 by Alexander Calder.

[ABDUA:19677](#)

Bronze halberd, with tapering midrib and three rivet holes. Part of a hoard of three halberds found in 1908 while making a bridge over a ditch on a farm near New Machar, Aberdeenshire.



14

[ABDUA:18237](#)

Flat axe mould, 2400-1800BC. Found while ploughing on the South face of Foudland Hill, Inch, Aberdeenshire.

Carved stone ball, granite, Cults Peterculter Aberdeenshire
