Funding

Ben Kneller represented UoA in Brasilia on September 28 for the signing of our "Science without Borders" contract (with BG and the Federal University of Rio Grande do Sul), in the presence of President Dilma Rousseff and David Cameron, as part of the PM's official visit to Brazil. The first five out of a total of 20 Brazilian PhD students to come to Aberdeen under the program arrived on 21st October.

David Macdonald, Randell Stephenson and Ben Kneller represented UoA in Recife, NE Brazil, at a meeting to launch a £10M project funded by BP, "Programa de Analise de Bacia Intracratonica de Parnaiba", aimed at understanding the origin of intracratonic basins. The project will involve five institutions in Brazil, plus Aberdeen, Oxford and Cambridge. Aberdeen will co-supervise two out of ten PhD projects (one on provenance and palaeogeography, the other on seismic refraction across the basin), and be involved in several others (sequence and seismic stratigraphy, igneous petrology, basin margins and structural geology, and passive seismology).

Presentations

Tom Haines gave a talk on the 'Diagenetic and Tectonic Evolution of Pore Networks in Carbonate Normal Fault Zones and their Effects on Permeability' at the EAGE Fault and Top Seals Conference in Montpellier, October 2012.

Randell Stephenson participated in the 15th International Symposium on Deep Seismic profiling of the Continents and their Margins – Seismix 2012, which was held near Beijing, China in late September. Randell moderated the final plenary session on the future of deep seismic profiling, and was co-author of several presentations with Polish and Ukrainian colleagues on various aspects of seismic profiling and tomographic studies in the Black Sea region.

Randell Stephenson also attended the AAPG Regional conference in Baku, early October, and presented a paper called: "Integrated crustal and basin geophysical studies in the north-eastern Black Sea area".
