RESEARCH SPOTLIGHT: MARINE SPATIAL PLANNING IN SCOTLAND

Marine planning is key to the delivery of offshore wind development and regional marine planning is the next step for this in Scotland. The roll out and processes were recently scrutinised by the Scottish Parliament Environment Climate Change and Land Reform Committee.

Anne-Michelle Slater presented to the Committee on: Using marine planning to balance competing demands on the marine environment: international comparisons, with Dr Tim Stojanovic, University of St Andrews and Dr Rachel Shucksmith, Shetland Marine Planner. The research, which contributed to the final report, reviewed marine planning in New Zealand, Norway, USA, Canada, England and Belgium. Although still in its infancy, there is much good practice in Scotland when compared with other jurisdictions.

The ECCLR committee recommended action on governance, resource and community engagement to facilitate and expedite marine planning implementation for Scottish waters.
