*The University of Aberdeen Library uses the **Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme (DDC)** to organise the resources on the shelves by subject. In the DDC:

- each subject is given a different number called a classmark (each classmark has at least 3 digits).
- each resource is allocated a classmark depending on its subject.
- 3 letters are added after the classmark for more precise shelving.
- these 3 letters are usually the first 3 letters of the author's family name, but not always.
- the classmark and the 3 letters make up the shelfmark.
- Within the same subject an author's works can be shelved next to one another.
