



During my first couple of years at the Lighthouse I did a mixture of short contracts and voluntary work – dolphin surveys, seal tagging and tracking, analysing and writing up data (I even got my first paper published!). For the following few years I co-ordinated the dolphin photo-ID work – back in the day when we used slide film! I was also lucky enough to be able to do a Masters using the dolphin photo-ID data alongside my job.

What are you doing now?
