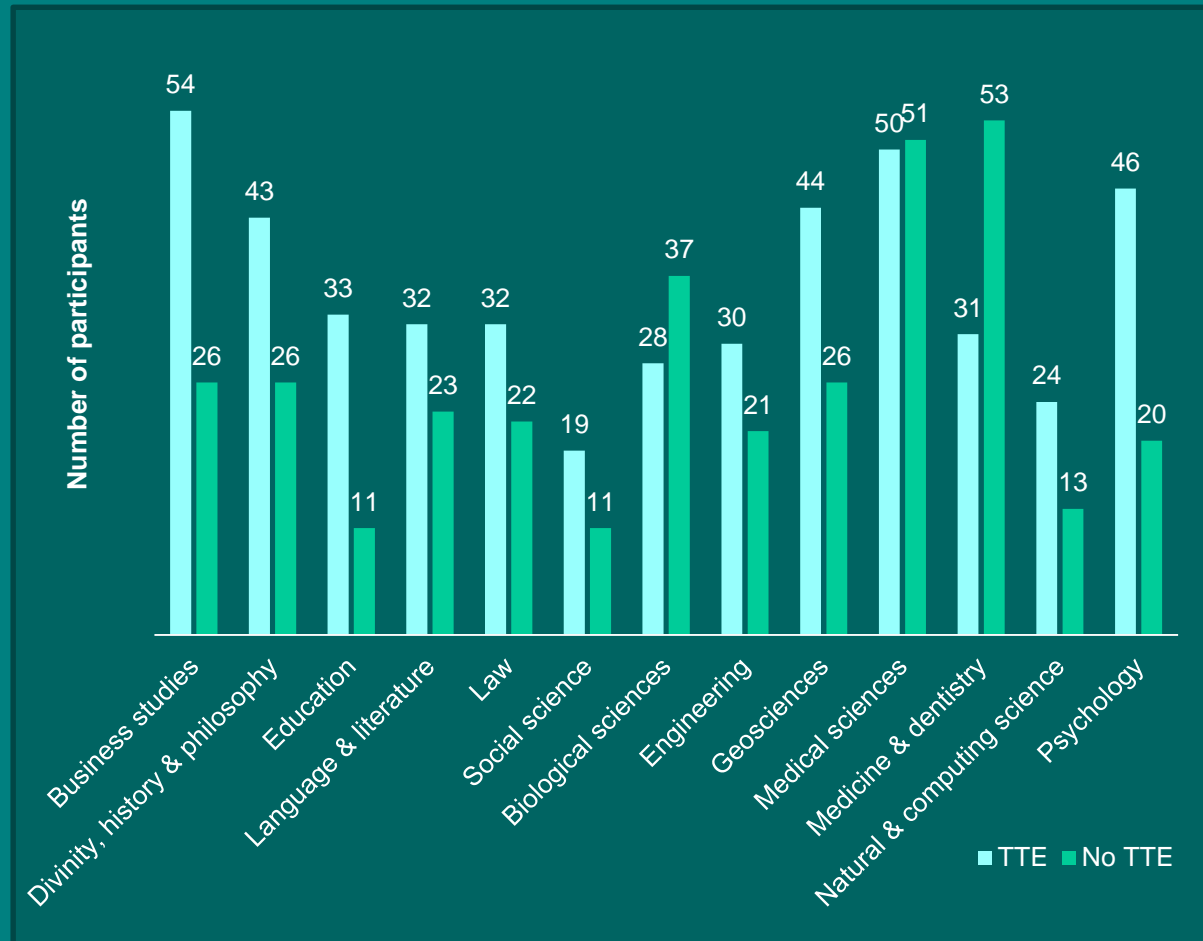

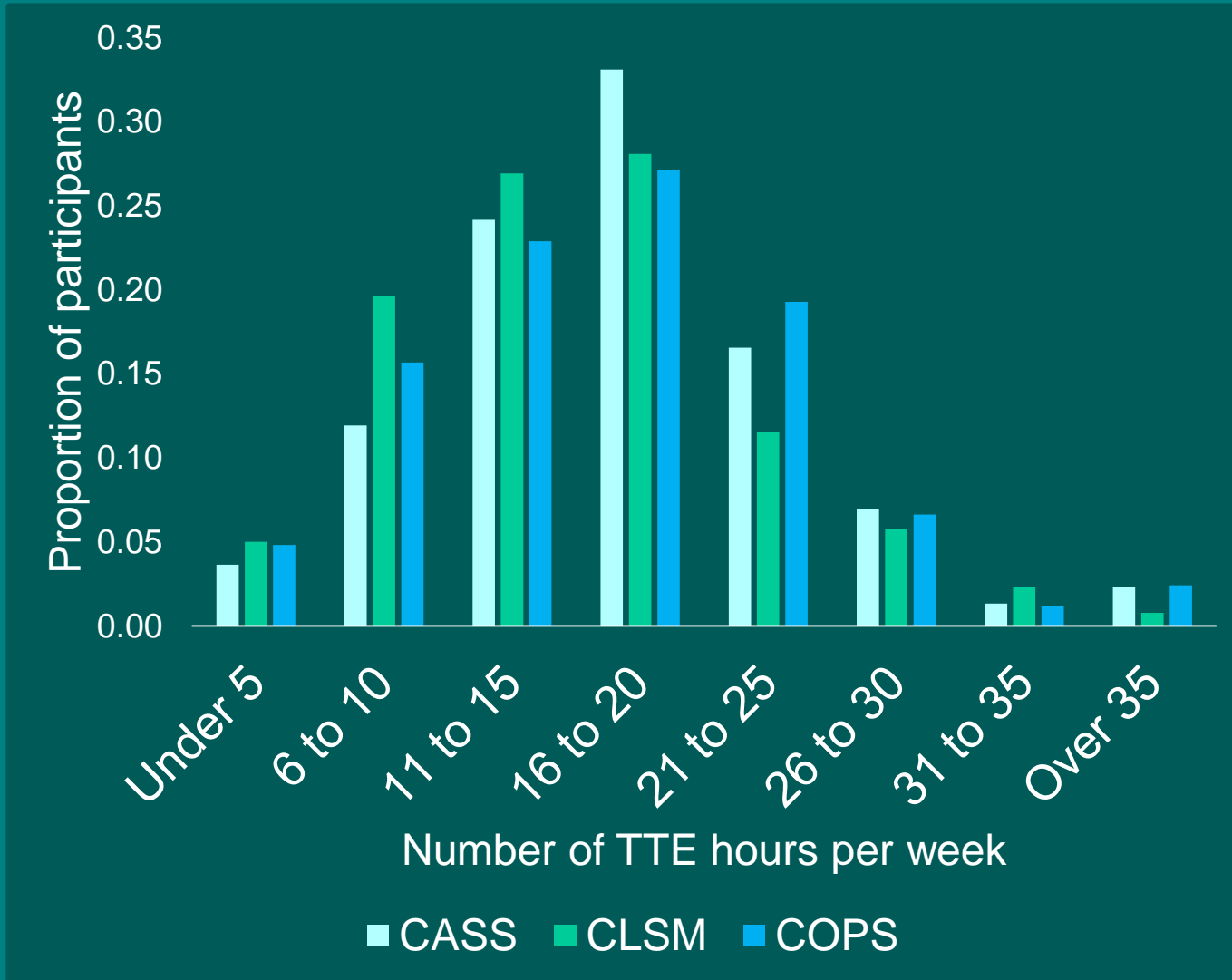
- 1304 undergraduates (/7000)

Sample demography

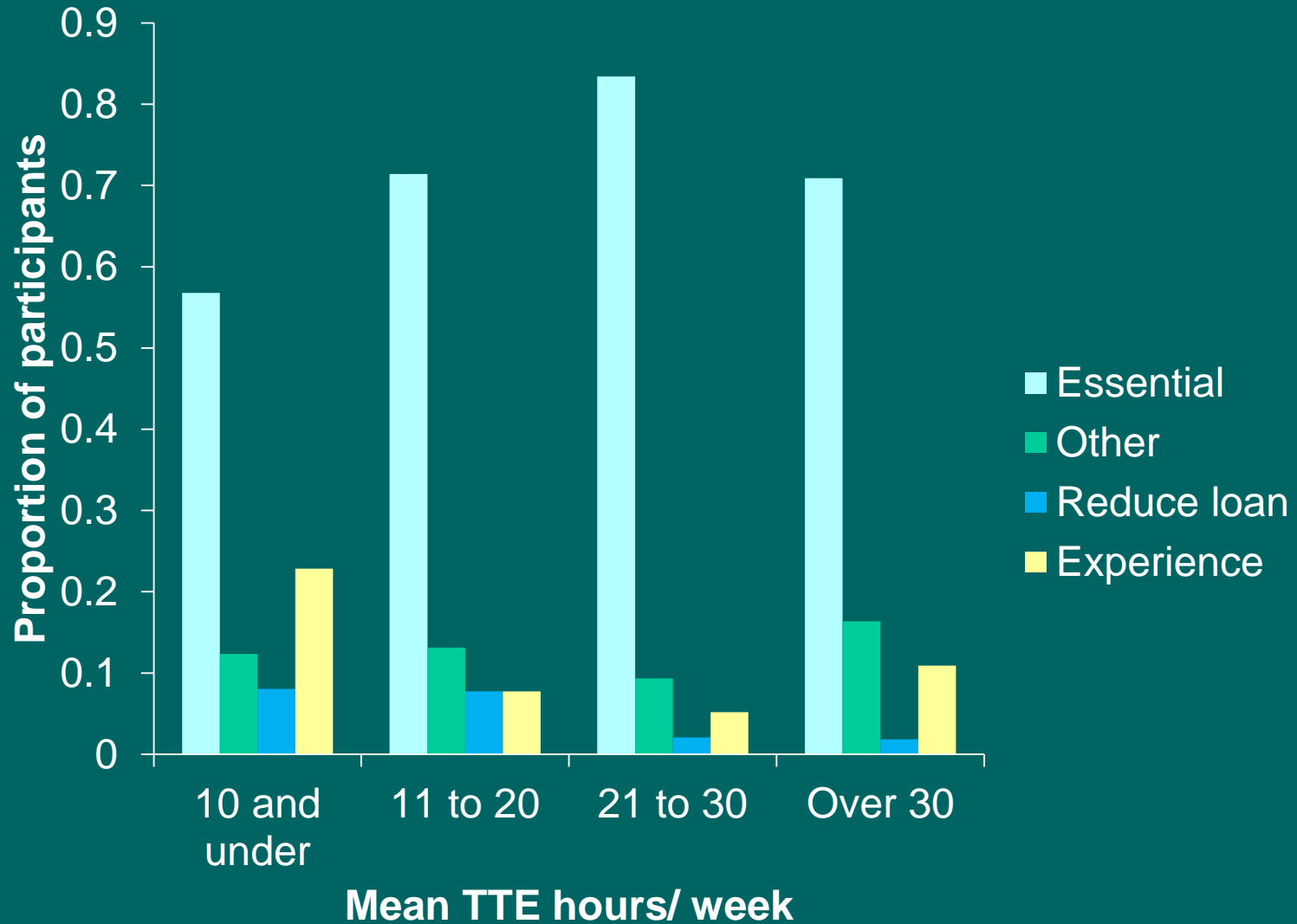
- 58 % female

- 69% (n = 902) in TTE



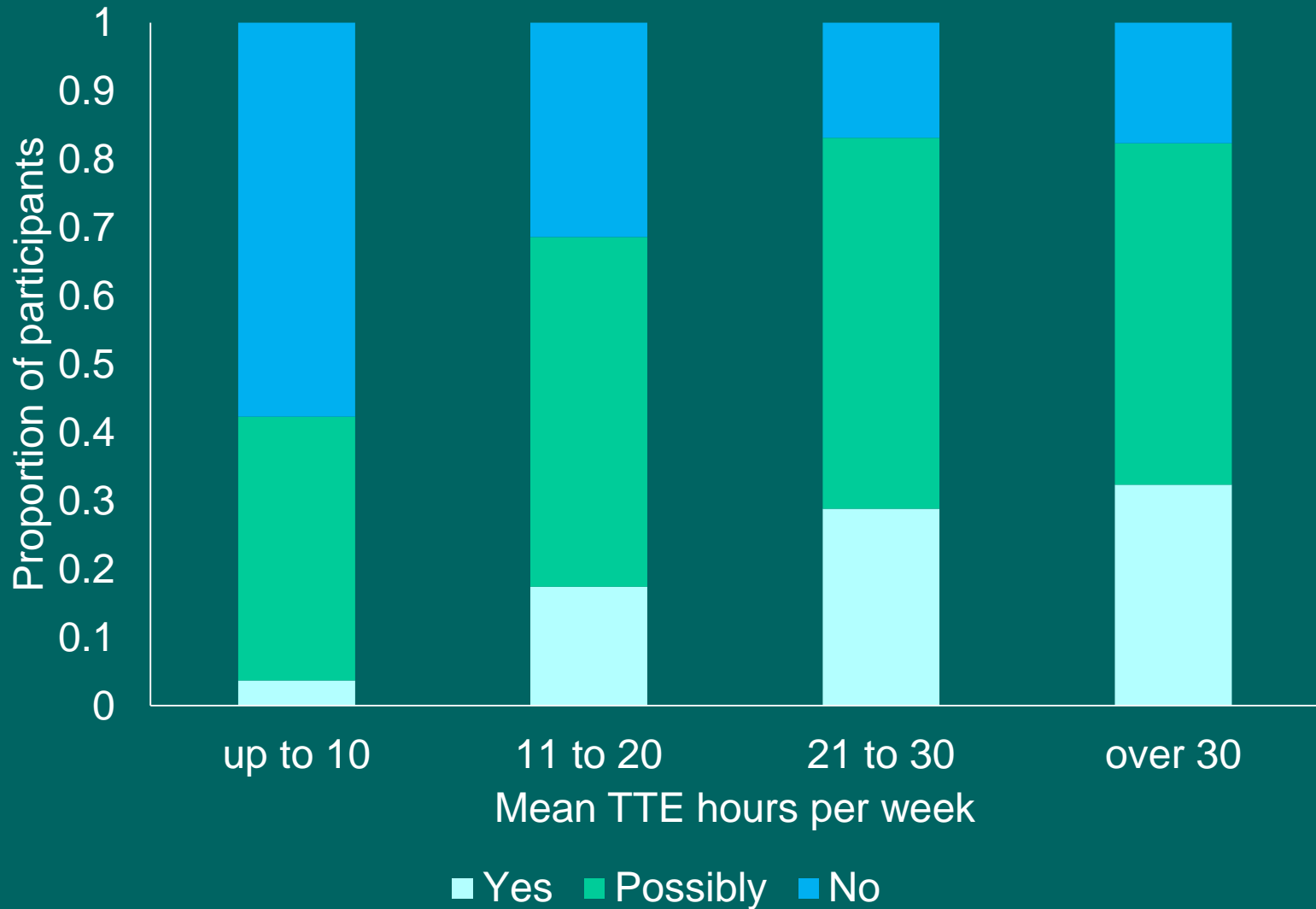
Hours spent in TTE



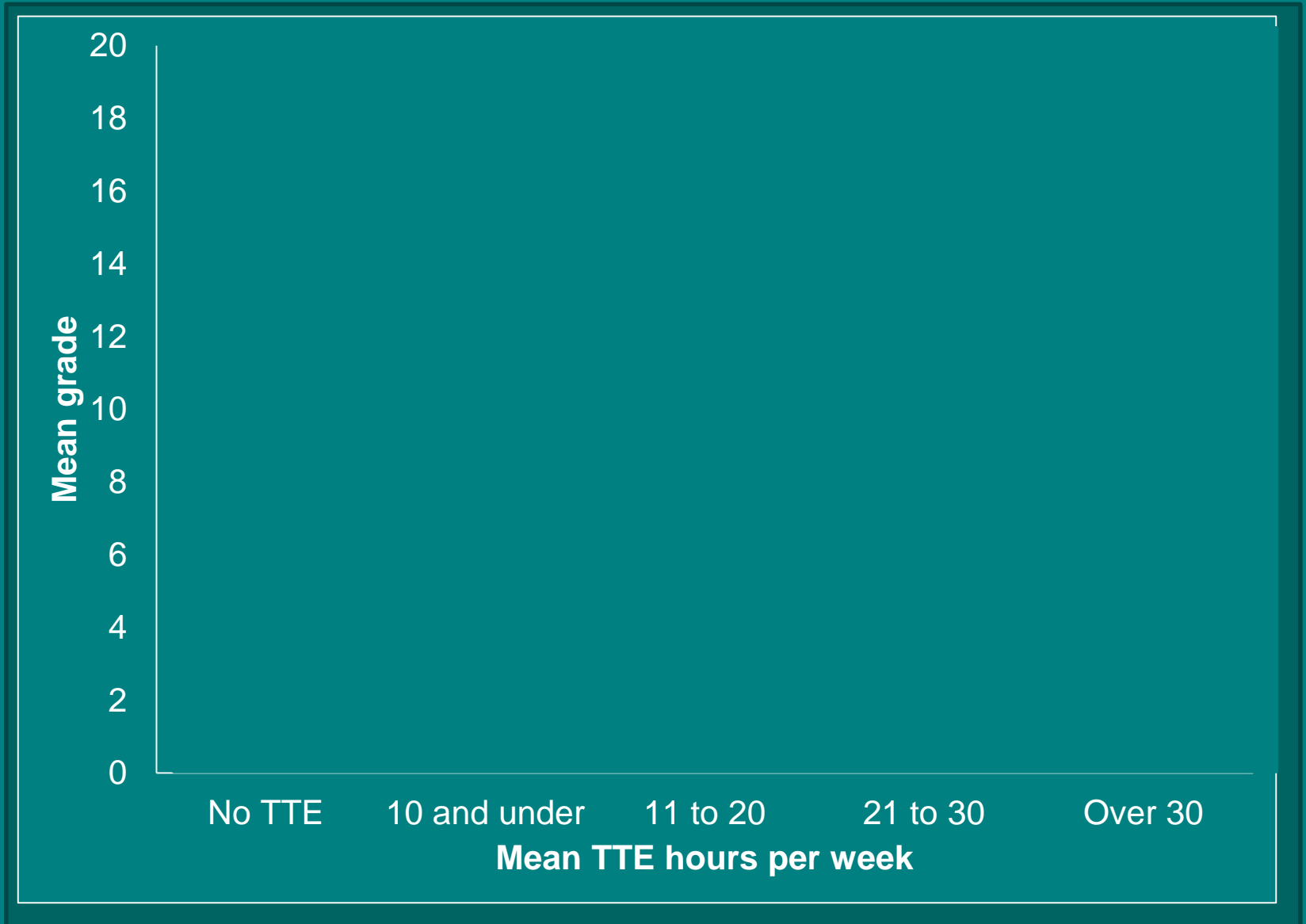
Reasons for undertaking TTE



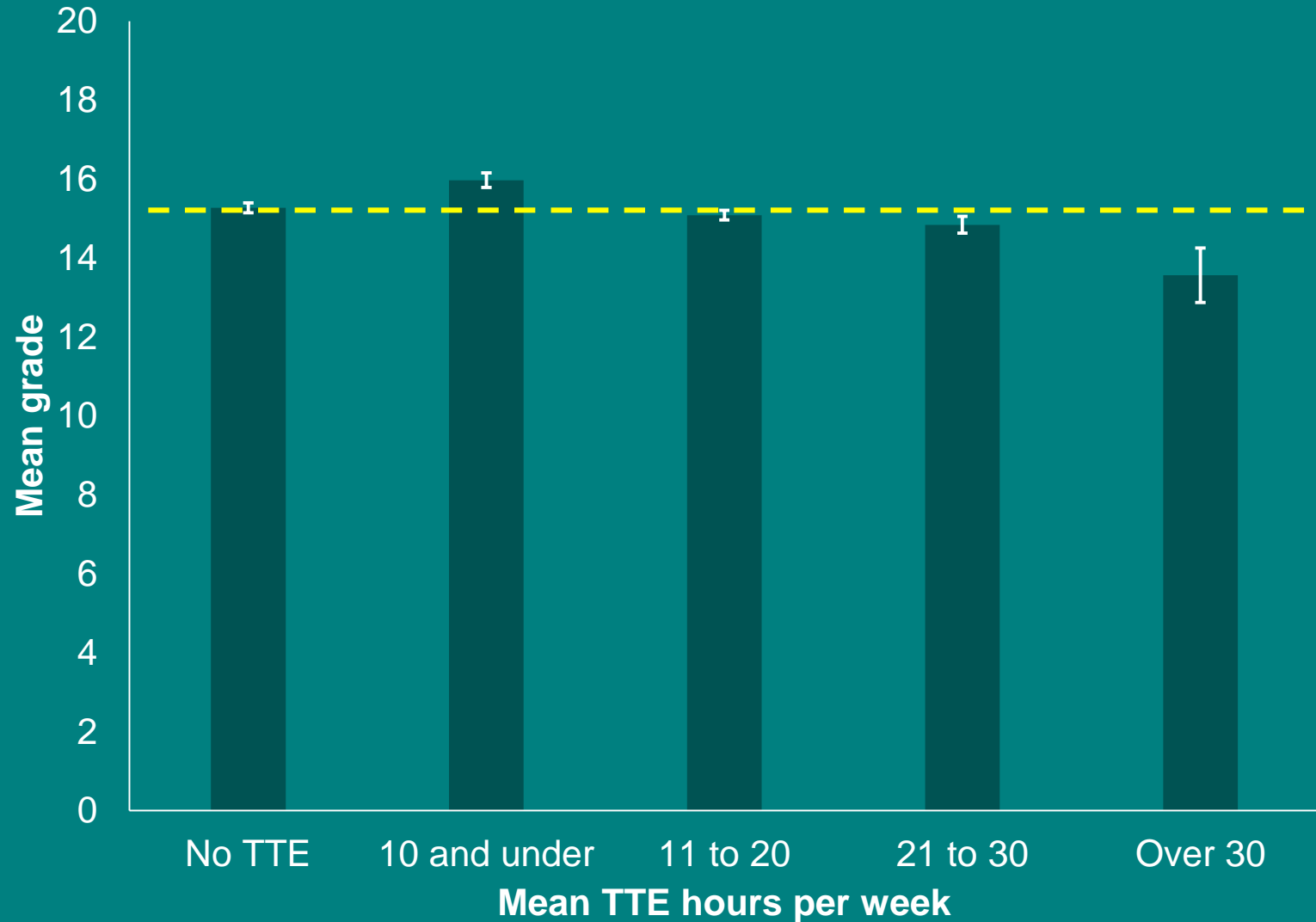

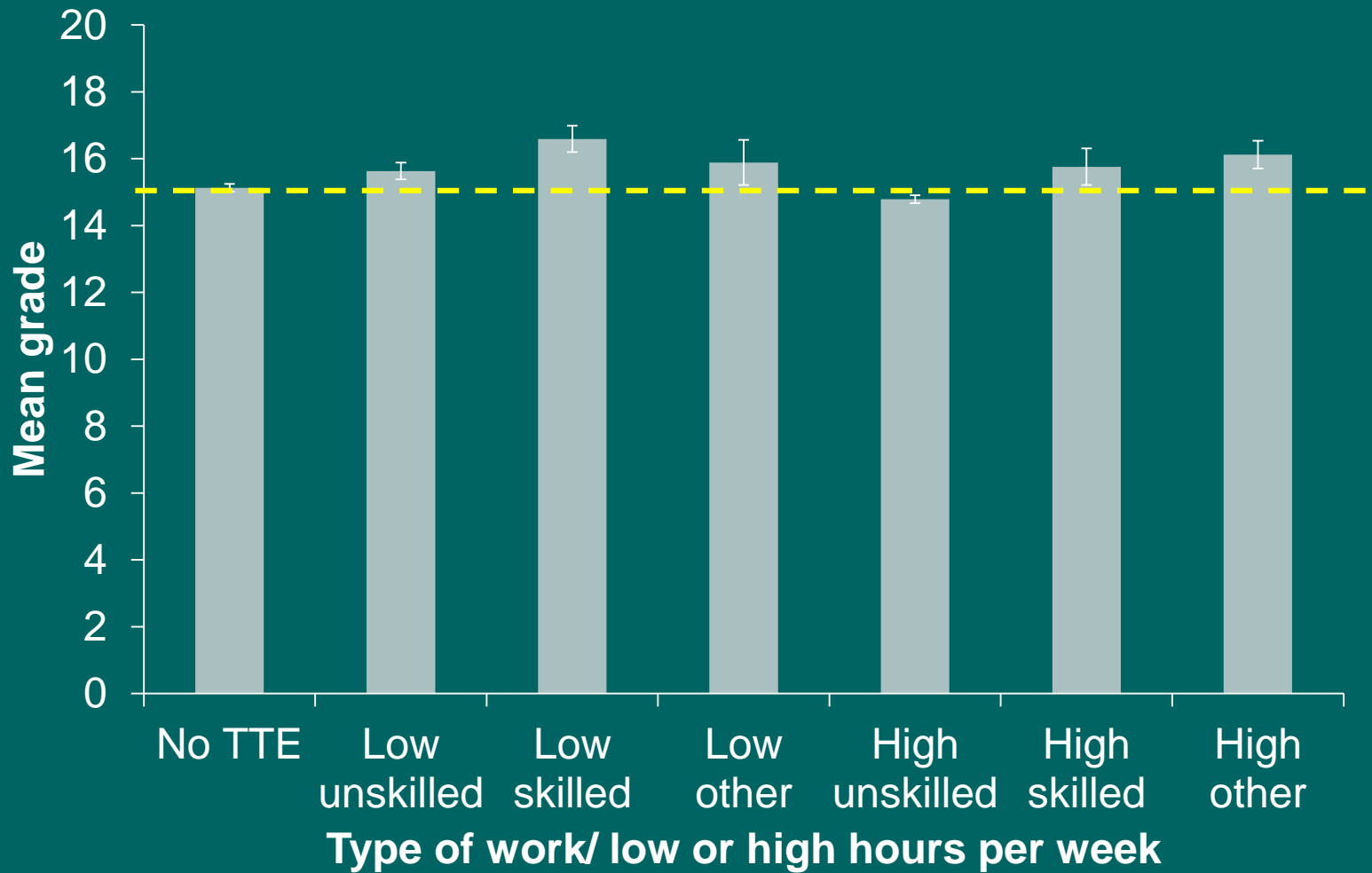
Grades and TTE hours
