STOP THEM TAKING YOUR BIKE FOR A RIDE

LOCK IT OR LOSE IT!

- Get a good bike lock D locks or combination locks are best.
- Always lock a bike through the frame when unattended - even if it is only for a few minutes.
- Where possible, lock it to a fence, tree or railing.
- Leave bikes where potential thieves could easily be seen by others or CCTV.

D Lock

- Remove accessories that cannot be secured such as lights, pumps and quick release saddles.
- Put bikes in a secure garage or shed at home and fasten them to the ground or wall anchor for extra security.

CYCLE SAFETY

- Protect your head. Wear a helmet.
- See and be seen. Use lights and wear reflective clothing.
- Stay alert. Listen and Look. Particularly at junctions.
- Obey the rules of the road.
- Use hand signals.
- Remember that some drivers just don't see you.
