3. Click on the icon under the content type, a search box will appear, and you can type in the title of the content that you want to highlight.



A maximum of five items can be selected as highlighted content, if you add more than 5 these will not be displayed as highlighted, and a warning will be shown on the page.

This research outputs will not be shown on the Pure Portal as the limit of 5 has be reached.	een
