This policy applies to those students¹ in Medicine & Dentistry, Education, and Counselling/Psychotherapy wishing to put forward a case against a recommendation that they be suspended or that their studies or candidature be terminated for certain specified awards on grounds of being judged not fit to practise.

- 1. The Degree Regulations² state the conditions by which students' studies as a candidate for a specified award may be suspended or terminated on the grounds that they are judged not "fit to practise".
- 2. Representations against suspension or termination of studies as a candidate for certain specified awards on grounds of being judged not fit to practise will be considered by the relevant Fitness to Practise Committee. Full details of the procedures to be followed in the relevant areas of study, including the remit and composition of the relevant Committee, are provided here for Degrees in Medicine & Dentistry and <u>here</u> for Degrees in Education and in Counselling/Psychotherapy.
- 3. The Senate has delegated authority to the Fitness to Practise Committees to hear cases referred to them and to take decisions on its behalf. Decisions of these Committees are therefore considered to be decisions of the Senate.
- 4. Students have the right to appeal against decisions that are taken under the terms of this Policy by Fitness to Practise Committees. Appeals will only be pursued in accordance with the terms as laid out in the University's Policy and Procedures on Student Appeals (sections 2 and 11.6 refer). The Fitness to Practise Guidance Notes (see above) also provide further information in this regard.
