UNDERGRADUATE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1. PURPOSE OF THE PAPER

This paper provides an overview of proposed minor changes to domestic undergraduate entry requirements.

3. RECOMMENDED ACTION

This paper is provided for discussion and approval.

We are proposing minor changes in the published domestic undergraduate entry requirements for some specific degrees to address some noticeable inconsistencies following the previous change made to standard requirements.

4. DISCUSSION

- 4.1 This paper outlines proposed changes to published domestic undergraduate entry requirements to take effect for the 2025 entry point and displayed in the 2026/7 prospectus.
- 4.2 The UG printed prospectus, used heavily across the Scottish and RUK market, will be printed in December 2024 for the 2026 cycle. The deadline for content changes is 2 December 2024.
- 4.3 The approach to offer making being taken in admissions to maximise entry from home fees applicants to undergraduate degrees in 2025 is outlined below. Although September 2024 saw a significant increase in home fees undergraduates (1597 students were recruited to non-controlled subjects compared to 1359 in 2023/24), it is recognised that we still face significant challenges in meeting home fees targets. Entry requirements are an opportunity for us to widen the net and maximise recruitment.
- 4.4 This committee agreed broad changes to the majority of entry requirements in early 2024. The 2025 entry published entry requirements for MA, Divinity, BSc and Engineering degrees are now:

Highers: Standard applicants - BBBB

Widening Access- BBC

A levels: Standard applicants – BBC

Widening Access- CCC

4.5 To ensure consistency with other qualification types, we have attempted to determine new entrance requirements for non-Higher/A level qualifications that we publish in the prospectus, using UCAS tariff points to ensure parity.

4.6 The International Baccalaureate is hard to allocate UCAS Tarriff points to as varies depending on the modules taken. If we look at competitor data, we can see in the below table that published IB scores required range from 27-39. Context is important here and from discussions in the recruitment team and with guidance teachers who send us IB students, an IB score less than 32 would harm our image with the prestige and rankings driven private international school applicant. We therefore suggest keeping the published IB requirement for standard degrees at 32. Flexibility will be taken at confirmation stage to maximise the intake from this group.

4.7 This paper also seeks to address the increased gap between the MA/BSc/BEng/BTh (regular) degree programme entry requirements and the BSc Biomedical Science, LLB Law MEng, MSci, MChem and MBus degrees, our flagship programmes. These suggestions were arrived at through discussion with academic colleagues in the schools, taking into account the previous ratio of MA/BSc:Flagship Programme Tarriff points. The other qualifications were then calculated as per 4.5. Competitor data is available in Appendix 1.

4.8 This paper also seeks to address the gap in requirements between 1st and 2nd year entry in all degree programmes. We have taken the same approach as above with this and have two grouping of degrees; the standard and the flagship programmes.

- 4.10 It is widely accepted across the sector, given the challenges in the PGT International Markets, that Universities across the UK will begin to protect and focus growing their market share from the domestic marketplace.
- 4.11 The University will need to refocus its efforts to gain more applications from the local and regional marketplace. This will mean from an entry tariff point of view, we need to become more attractive to a wider and broader set of potential applicants in Aberdeenshire, and the Central belt, directly competing for students that would traditionally consider themselves for universities such as RGU. If this paper is approved, a robust local marketing campaign will be required to maximise benefits of this change in position in an attempt to take market share from RGU who are well established in the local region as the University of choice.

4.12 The approval process to change entry requirements is as follows. If approved at SRC, we propose seeking approval from QAC by circulation to meet imminent prospectus print deadlines.
