

## The campus:



- Library with over 500,000 volumes and electronic access to digital data banks.
- Foreign language center: English, French, Italian, German and Spanish. Multimedia self-access language laboratory. The Language Center also offers a conversation club program in which foreign students are encouraged to participate.
- Sport facilities: gym, indoor playing courts, outdoor playing fields and courts, and track and field facilities.
- 102 specialized laboratories for electronics; systems; networks; electronic design; civil; industrial; mechanical and chemical engineering; process simulation; television; radio; photography; design and multimedia.
- 49 tree-shaded hectares (100 acres) with a botanical garden and water-treatment plant.
- Technology Park, a facility devoted to the research, design and development of high quality, technology-based projects and businesses.
- Bank branch, travel agency, bookstore, and infirmary.

## Casa ITESO Clavigero

This extension of the University promotes the cultural heritage of the region and the building itself was recognized as an "Artistic Monument of the Nation" by the National Institute of Fine Arts (INBA) in 2006. It is located in the city center of Guadalajara and is frequently used as a venue for expositions, workshops, seminars and conferences.



# The University Experience:

ITESO offers you the following programs to enhance your experience as an international student.

- Three plus One Program: Designed specifically for students with lower levels or no previous Spanish studies. It affords students the opportunity to take curricular courses taught in English plus one Spanish language course.
- Professional Application Projects (PAP): These projects are intimately linked with the society. PAP are designed to improve the quality of life of others and to reinforce the social commitment students will have within their given profession. The student will apply knowledge, professional skills, and direct participation in the proposal and implementation of plans and strategies, creating solutions to local issues. The teams of students and professors are interdisciplinary and because of their work with the community, a B2 level of Spanish is required. PAP are registered as courses within the ITESO curriculum.
- Service learning projects: Experiences providing encounters and interaction between students and rural or urban communities, with some of the major projects being related to popular education, environmental justice and migration.
- Cultural and art programs: Include courses and workshops in music, literature, visual arts, performance. All of them open to international students, and designed to develop your creative skills and make your stay at ITESO a unique experience.
