In terms of the 27th Section of the Act of Parliament, 2d and 3d of the King, chap. 65, entitled, "An Act to amend the Representation of the People in Scotland," the Town-Clerk of Aberdeen has divided the City into Districts, for Polling at the Election of a Member to serve in Parliament for the City of Aberdeen; and has fixed Polling-Places for the different Districts—a List of which Districts and Polling-Places follows:—

1ST DISTRICT,

Comprehending East and St. Clement's Parishes.

POLLING-PLACE,

AT OR NEAR WEIGH-HOUSE SQUARE

2D DISTRICT,

Comprehending North and Greyfriars Parishes.

POLLING-PLACE,

AT OR NEAR THE NORTH SIDE OF CASTLE STREET.

3D DISTRICT,

Comprehending West and South Parishes.

POLLING-PLACE,

AT OR NEAR THE NORTH GATE OF ROBERT GORDON'S HOSPITAL.
