

## MLITT IN COMPARATIVE LITERATURE (SEPTEMBER START) (MLitt/PgDip/PgCert)

*Duration:* 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (MLitt); 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (PgDip).

*Content:* Candidates undertake the following EL coded level 5 courses.

### FULL TIME ROUTE

#### Stage 1

##### Students must take the following:

PD5006 Getting Started at the University of Aberdeen (0 credit points)  
LI5002 Comparative Literary Studies (30 credit points)

##### Plus one 30 credit point course from the following:

EL50C1 Locations and Dislocations: The Role of Place in Literature (30 credits points)  
EL50C5 The Novel: Environments and Encounters (30 credit points)  
EL50D2 Fundamentals of English Language (30 credit points)  
FS5022 Research Methods in Film and Visual Culture (30 credit points)  
LN5009 Key Concepts and Methods in Translation Studies (30 credit points)

#### Stage 2

##### Students must take the following:

LI5503 Specialist Literary Study 1 (15 credit points)  
LI5504 Specialist Literary Study 2 (15 credit points)

##### Plus one 30 credit point course from the following:

EL55C2 Writing the Self (30 credit points)  
EL55C7 Infinite Scotlands: Scotland and the Literary Imagination (30 credit points)  
EL55D1 Approaching English Language and Literature (30 credit points)  
EL55D3 Places and Environments: Critical Dialogues (30 credit points)  
LN 5512 Additional Language-Specific Translation Portfolio (15 credit points)  
LN 5513 Literary Translation (15 credit points)

#### Stage 3

##### Students must take the following:

LI5901 Dissertation in Comparative Literature (60 credit points)

### PART TIME ROUTE

Students take 30 credits each semester, including the core options outlined above, with the dissertation to be submitted at the end of the second year.

**Assessment:** By combination of coursework, written and oral examinations where appropriate for each course. The degree of MLitt shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a CGS Grade of 9 (D3) or above in LN5901, irrespective of their performance in other courses.
