Duration: 12 months full-time, normally 24 months part-time.

## Content:

Full Time students take 60 credits per semester. Part time normally take 30 credits per semester.

Students require 180 credits to complete the LLM (120 for a Postgraduate Diploma and 60 credits for a Postgraduate Certificate).

Courses with the prefix LS50 run in September.

Courses with the prefix LS55 run in January.

LS5909 **Professional Skills: International Trade Negotiation** runs over the summer with two weeks on-campus summer school attendance required.

Students must take the following **compulsory** courses:

LS502V (September start) or LS552X (January start) **Critical Legal Thinking and Scholarship** (0 credit points)

LS503B International Sale of Goods (15 credit points)

LS503D Financing of International Sales (15 credit points)

LS554Q World Trade Organization: GATT (30 credit points) (This course is a pre-requisite for LS5909 Professional Skills)

LS5909 **Professional Skills: International Trade Negotiation** (60 credit points) (Only taken after completion of LS503A/LS553A Core Principles of World Trade Organization or LS554Q World Trade Organization: GATT)

The remaining 60 credit points must be taken from the **optional** courses below:

LS501W/LS552E Legal Principles (30 credit points)

LS501Y Mediation Theory and Practice (30 credit points)

LS504M International Commercial Arbitration (30 credit points)

LS503E International Investment Law (15 credit points)

LS503F International Investment Arbitration (15 credit points)

LS551X Negotiation Skills (30 credit points)

Assessment: By course work, by written examination, or by a combination of these, as prescribed for each course. The degree of LLM shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a CGS grade of D3 or above in the specified dissertation course, irrespective of their performance in other courses: such candidates may, at the discretion of the Examiners, be awarded a Postgraduate Diploma or a Postgraduate Certificate.

\*For students who started this programme before September 2024, LS503A/LS553A and LS503C/LS553C were a pair of compulsory courses. For students who have already passed LS503A/LS553A only, LS503C will be offered for the final time in September 2024
