HA552U Scotland's Visual History (30 credit points) (HA552U will run in 2018/19)

(HI552T & HA552U will run in alternate years)

36 MONTHS PART TIME ROUTE

This route will run over three years. Students will take a maximum of 180 credit points over the two years. 60 credit points must be taken in Year 1. 60 credit points must be taken in Year 2. 60 credit points (the dissertation) must be taken in Year 3.

Year 3

Students must take the following course:

HI5916 Dissertation in Scottish Heritage (60 credit points)

Assessment: The taught elements will be assessed by course work, by written examination or by a combination of these, as prescribed for each course. The dissertation will be assessed by submission. An oral examination may be held at the discretion of the Examiners. The degree of MLitt shall not be awarded to candidates who fail to achieve CGS D3 or above in the dissertation, irrespective of their performance in other courses.
