

## **ARCHAEOLOGY OF THE NORTH (JANUARY START) (MSc/PgDip/PgCert)**

*Duration:* 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (MSc); 9 months full-time or 21 months part-time (PgDip); 4 months full-time or 8 months part-time over 2 years (PgCert).

### *Content:*

Candidates shall be required to attend the following designated programme of courses:

### **FULL TIME ROUTE**

#### Stage 1

AY5501 Northern Peoples and Culture (30 credit points)  
AY5504\* Advanced Archaeological Approaches (30 credit points)

#### Stage 2

AY5904 Dissertation in Archaeology (0 credit points) (this course will continue in stage 3 with the code AY5007 )

Candidates who complete the above programme at CGS Grade of D3 or above will be allowed to progress to Stage 3.

#### Stage 3

AY5001 Northern Worlds (30 credit points)  
AY5002\* Theory and Method in Research (30 credit points)  
AY5007 Dissertation in Archaeology (60 credit points)

\*Subject to agreement, the course can be replaced with other Archaeology courses or one from a sister discipline, such as Anthropology (note, only a maximum of 30 credits can be taken in non-archaeology courses across Stages 1 and 2).

### **PART TIME ROUTE**

#### Year 1

AY5904 Dissertation in Archaeology (0 credit points) (this course will continue in stage 3 with the code AY5007)

#### Year 3

AY5001 Northern Worlds (30 credit points)  
AY5007 Dissertation in Archaeology (60 credit points)

*Assessment:* By in course assessment through the presentation of a project and written material, as prescribed for each course, and by submission of a dissertation. The degree of MSc shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to complete the dissertation at a CGS Grade of D3 or above, irrespective of their performance in other courses.
