1.	Language competency levels are listed as a guide, courses may vary based on ability and are subject to diagnostic testing.
2.	The Psychology Honours degree is accredited by the British Psychological Society for graduate membership provided graduate have passed all the Level 3 courses and the Level 4 thesis PS 4019 and obtain an overall degree at 2:2 (Lower Second Class Honours) or above. Honours students will be debarred from continuing into level 4 by the Head of School unless they sat the degree examinations at the first opportunity (certified illness excepted) and passed all the Level 3 courses either at the first opportunity or at the June diet of examinations in the same academic year.
3.	GH 3022 runs across both half sessions.
4.	Honours programme may only be taken by full time study
5.	Candidates seeking entry to the Junior Honours programme must have accumulated, by award or recognition, or been exempted from, at least 240 credit points at levels 1 and 2, including the prescribed courses required to enter programme year 3.
