

Spinoza's Ethics

Philosophy of Religion Seminar

For Autumn 2024 we will be reading through one of the most philosophically and theologically influential books in western history: Spinoza's posthumous work, the *Ethics*. We will be doing so in conversation with an excellent introductory text *Spinoza's Ethics* by Aberdeen's own Beth Lord.

Our pattern will be to use Prof. Lord's book as a guide to the reading (extremely helpful to newcomers to the text) and then spend the bulk of our time together with the primary text of the *Ethics*. Our aim will be to read the 200 or so pages of the *Ethics* by the end of the autumn term.
