Comparative Assessment (CA) is a multi-criteria decision analysis process commonly used globally and not just in the decommissioning industry but across multiple other industries. There are views that CA methodologies are overly complex, opaque, and biased towards decommissioning assets in situ. IOGP held a workshop in September 2022 to discuss the perception of bias, to agree guiding principles for a genuine CA and to discuss CA good practices. In this session, IOGP will set the scene by presenting the workshop outcomes. Various industry stakeholders including OPRED and NGOs are invited to present their views of how industry makes decisions, discussing their concerns and views of good practices.
