This seminar will be presented by Dr Edward Sosu who is a lecturer in the School of Education at Strathclyde University, Glasgow. Between 2008 and 2013, he worked at the University of Aberdeen. Dr Sosu has a background in both education and psychology. He has a strong interest in quantitative methods and his current research, funded by the British Academy, is focused on examining the developmental trajectory of problem behaviour in preschool children using advanced statistical modelling techniques.

In the Open Space Seminar, Dr Sosu will discuss the role of Quantitative Methods in educational research. He will highlight some of the key advantages, demystify the quantitative approach, and discuss some exciting opportunities for those wanting to embark on this journey.

The afternoon workshop will use a hands-on approach that takes participants through the design of quantitative research and how to select the most appropriate methods/statistical tests to answer your research questions. Both the seminar and workshop will draw on concrete examples to inform the discussions.
