Ethics: Equality and Inclusion in our Research

The purpose of this workshop is to explore the place of ethics in research for both staff and research students across the School of Education. Many people in the school are involved in research which includes partners in schools, community and care settings both as participants and as co-constructors of research projects. This workshop sets out to explore how to embed ethics into the long term planning and implementation of research. The ideas in the workshop are drawn from work carried out by the Centre for Social Justice and Community Action at Durham University published in '*Community-based participatory research: a guide to ethical principles and practice.*' (2102, Durham University available at: <http://www.publicengagement.ac.uk/how-we-help/our-publications/community-based-participatory-research-guide-to-ethical-principle>). This guide sets out 7 ethical principles which provide a framework which supports researchers to consider ideas such as mutual respect, equality and inclusion, democratic participation, active learning, making a difference, collective action and personal integrity.

Participants at this workshop will be invited to consider these principles in relation to their current and developing research and to think through ethical dilemmas and issues. The workshop is for people who are developing research ideas, as well as those who are currently engaged in research whether externally funded or not.
