1	Candidates seeking entry to the Junior Honours programme must have accumulated, by award or recognition, or been exempted from, at least 240 credit points at levels 1 and 2, including the prescribed courses required to enter programme year 3.
2	Students are required to have exactly 240 credits at levels 3 and 4, at least 210 of which must be AC, EC, FI, IB or MS coded, and. At least 90 credits must be at level 4.
3	MBus students take year 4 as a Placement, if available, either in the UK or abroad as agreed with the Business School.
4	The Accountancy specialism is NOT accredited by the accountancy professional bodies.
5	Students need to follow a specialism through years 1 and 2 to ensure that they have sufficient prerequisites to follow courses in years 3 and 4 (with or without a specialism at that stage).
6	Students are required to undertake either FI 3503, International Finance Management, or FI 3505, Advanced Corporate Finance. These courses run in alternate years, with FI 3503 running in Academic Year 2024/25.
