1.	Candidates must take AY 3512 Archaeological Research Project Part 1 AND AY 4002 Archaeological Research Project Part 2 or write a dissertation in Geography (GG 4023).
2.	Candidates seeking entry to the Junior Honours programme must have accumulated, by award or recognition, or been exempted from, at least 240 credit points at levels 1 and 2, including the prescribed courses required to enter programme year 3.
3.	Acceptable Geography courses for Programme Years 3 and 4 are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • any Level 3 or 4 GG-coded course • any Level 3 or 4 MR-coded course • SX 3501, SX 3505 and SX 3508
4.	Students are advised to take at least one of GG 3570 or GG 3575
5.	Students wanting to do one of the Honours field courses (GG 4573 or GG 4574) must register for these in Programme Year 3. This may entail registering for an extra 15 credits. Note that the trips run in the summer vacation.
