FULL TIME ROUTE

Stage 1

Candidates must take the following compulsory courses:

Stage 3

Candidates must take the following courses:

- PI5001 Strategic Theory (30 credit points)
- PI5025 Energy Politics (15 credit points)
- BU5053 Introduction to Energy Economics (15 credit points)

PART TIME ROUTE

Year 1

Students will select 30 credit points from the following:

- PI5502 Global Security Issues (30 credit points)
- PI5518 International Energy Security (30 credit points)

Year 2

Students can take up to 120 credit points in the year.

All students must take the following:

- PI5901 Dissertation in Strategic Studies (60 credit points)

Students will select 30 credit points from the following:

- PI5001 Strategic Theory (30 credit points)
- PI5025 Energy Politics (15 credit points)
- BU5053 Introduction to Energy Economics (15 credit points)

Students will select 30 credit points from the following. Courses taken in previous years cannot be taken again:

Year 3

Students will select 30 credit points from the following Courses taken in previous years cannot be taken again:

- PI5001 Strategic Theory (30 credit points)
- PI5025 Energy Politics (15 credit points)

Assessment: By coursework, written examination, or a combination thereof, as prescribed for each course, and by submission of a dissertation.
