

Duration: 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (MSc); 9 months full-time or 18 months part-time (PgDip); 4 months full time or 8 months part time (PgCert).

Stage 3

AT5902 Dissertation in People and Environment (60 credit points)

Assessment: By in course assessment through the presentation of project and written material, as prescribed for each course, and by submission of a dissertation. The degree of MSc will not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve CGS grade of D3 or above in the dissertation, irrespective of their marks in other courses.

PART TIME ROUTE

This route will run over two years. Students can take up to 120 credit points in a single year. AT5902 must be taken in Year 2. The following courses are compulsory and can be taken in either Year 1 or Year 2:
