*Duration:* 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (MSc); 9 months full-time or 21 months part-time (PgDip); 4 months full-time or 8 months part-time over 2 years (PgCert).

#### Stage 2

AY5504\* Advanced Archaeological Approaches (30 credit points)

Candidates who complete the above programme at CGS Grade of D3 or above will be allowed to progress to Stage 3.

*Assessment:* By in course assessment through the presentation of a project and written material, as prescribed for each course, and by submission of a dissertation. The degree of MSc shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to complete the dissertation at CGS Grade of D3 or above, irrespective of their performance in other courses.
